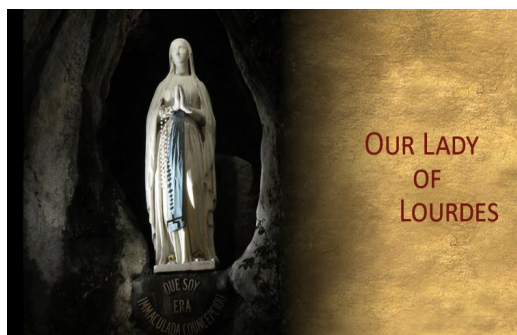


## From the Music Director

## *Immaculate Mary*

The first appearance of the Blessed Virgin to Bernadette Soubirous, her sister and their friend was on February 11, 1858, at a cave in the Massabielle cliffs of the Pyrenees. Seventeen other apparitions followed. For the fourth one, Soubirous carried a lit candle, so others who accompanied her started doing the same, originating this custom. During the 13<sup>th</sup> apparition, the lady commanded Soubirous: "Go, tell the priests to come here in procession and to build a chapel here." Three years later, they started building the first of the churches, which is now known as the "Crypt". By 1873, official national pilgrimages had begun to this place of healing.

In 1882 a priest from Lucon adapted a traditional folk song of the Pyrenees to accompany these candlelight processions of pilgrims to the cave each night. With its "Ave Maria" refrain, this tune became known as the LOURDES HYMN. His original 8 stanzas were extended to 120 as the procession grew! Many different versions exist around the globe. The one we sing today as "Immaculate Mary" was published by a priest of the Archdiocese of New York in 1862. Happy Feast of Our Lady of Lourdes!

To the Clergy, Staffs, and Faithful of Deanery Queens 5,

On Wednesday, November 29<sup>th</sup>, under the direction of Bishop Brennan, I met with the priests of your deanery to discuss the current pastoral situation in the parishes so we can begin to plan for the best way to continue to evangelize and proclaim the Gospel in your deanery while facing the reality of limited personnel and resources.

Earlier in the fall, there was a Convocation of Priests where Bishop Brennan opened the discussion of beginning a process of creating parish partnerships and parish mergers across the diocese. The priests of the deanery met together on that day and discussed the following:

- Priests expressed a concern of the reduced attendance at Masses in a number of parishes across the diocese.
- Some parishes in the deanery are still struggling with lower attendance after COVID, though overall pastors feel that the numbers are not bad.
- With the livestreaming of Masses, are people staying home? Will they come back to church if we stop livestreaming?
- Academies are like private schools.
- People are moving.
- There are various concerns about changing Mass schedules and providing Communion services, both during the year and during vacation periods.
- No priest is living alone in the deanery.
- Language issues:
  - With regard to Polish, some families choose to go to St. Hedwig or parishes in Greenpoint because they prefer a homily in Polish. Locally, some go to Sacred Heart for special needs. While some Polish families have moved away over the years, the congregation at St. Josaphat is also impacted by the type of Polish ministry provided.
  - Korean is holding its own – large overall population.
  - Indian is holding its own.
  - Spanish is not needed.

- The average weekly Mass attendance reported by parishes during 2022/2023:

In addition to the information that was shared, some concerns raised by the priests include:

- The response to the bishop's letter provided in parish bulletins was mixed: some priests received no feedback, and others had several responses from parishioners.
- With regard to strategies for changing Mass schedules:
  - Some parishes established a summer schedule that simply remained in effect in the fall.
  - Instead of eliminating a Mass from the schedule, some parishes have changed the entire schedule.
  - Two parishes spoke of eliminating the Sunday evening Mass without any negative feedback from parishioners.
- Two parishes have begun an initial conversation about a possible partnership.

I share the notes of the meeting with you so that you are aware of some of the more immediate concerns that your pastors are facing. In the months ahead, they will continue to work together and provide opportunities for parishioners to be a part of the discussion so that Bishop Brennan can make decisions that will first and foremost help us to proclaim the Gospel of Jesus Christ most effectively, while at the same time minimize the administrative burdens that can detract from the important work of the Church in your part of Queens. As we face changes in parish structures and administration, I believe that it also highlights the importance of stewardship among the faithful in our communities. The generous gifts of time, talent, and treasure are needed now more than ever, and they are always ways for parishioners to build the community and respond to the needs of their brothers and sisters. The Church is truly blessed by all of us working together as the Body of Christ.

As this New Year begins, may we entrust ourselves to Mary, the Mother of God, whose intercession accompanies us as we strive to be faithful disciples. May God bless our bishop and our diocese.
